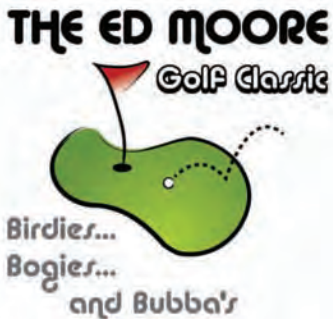

The 2012 Karen Williams Memorial Lecturer

HARVEY G. KLEIN, M.D.

has been named the 2012 Karen Williams Memorial Lecturer.

Dr. Klein is Chief, Department of Transfusion Medicine, and has been Special Assistant to the Director for science at the Clinical Center of the National Institutes of

Health. Dr. Klein received his medical degree from the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine, and completed both his residency and hematology fellowship at The Johns Hopkins Hospital. He remains Adjunct Professor of Medicine and Pathology at Johns Hopkins.

Dr. Klein has authored or co-authored more than 250 publications pertaining to blood transfusion, including transfusion-transmitted disease, the management of immunosuppressive effects of blood transfusion, and the impact of biotechnology

on transfusion medicine. He co-authored the latest edition of Mollison's Blood Transfusion in Clinical Medicine, the acknowledged "gold standard" for textbooks in this discipline. Dr. Klein is editor-in-chief emeritus of the Journal of Clinical Apheresis and has served on the editorial board of Blood. He is currently an editor of Transfusion and Transfusion Medicine Reviews.

The Karen Williams Memorial Lecture Award, named to honor the late Karen Williams. Karen was not only a valued member of the SCABB Board of Directors, respected colleague and friend, but she was also a cherished Chiron / Novartis employee who was dedicated to her profession. Karen's leadership and commitment to serving her customers promoted blood safety throughout the country.

To support continuing education in blood safety and to honor Karen's memory, Chiron endowed the Karen Williams Memorial Lectureship. The lectureship, which was funded by the Chiron Foundation and supplemented by Chiron, a Novartis company, was established to facilitate the ability of the South Central Association of Blood Banks to attract highly qualified speakers to the Annual Meeting by providing an annual monetary award to cover travel and conference expenses, and a speaker honorarium.

→ Understanding the Complexities of Rh

Following the SCABB award winning lectures in the morning, AIMS participants will delve into the Rh blood group. The session will begin with a review of reagents from the human and polyclonal antibodies of the past to the new monoclonal reagents used today. How can you compare the two when classifying "D^u", weak D, partial D, D variants or whatever we call them today? Next will be a review of Rh at the molecular level with special emphasis on variant RHCE genes found more frequently in Blacks. Questions like - "Do we need to genotype match for Rh in sickle cell patients?" will be addressed.

→ Moulds in the Morning

The ever fun session will be minus one Moulds but the vacancy will be adequately filled by internationally recognized immunohematologist Dr. George Garratty. He will present the first **John Moulds Memorial Lectureship** which will give tips on how to differentiate between warm, cold and combo autoimmune hemolytic anemias and other causes of hemolysis. The lecture on how the monocyte monolayer assay (MMA) can be used to identify clinically significant antibodies and select units for transfusion will be of particular interest to those in a transfusion service. We all keep SOPs and books of reagent manufacturer directions; but have you read them recently? Do you know what your reagents can and cannot do or how they compare to molecular techniques—find the answers in this session.

→ QA & Regulatory

Yes, we know it's a dry topic but with the newly published AABB standards for the IRL and the new Molecular Testing Accreditation Program, inquiring minds need to know! The issue of charging for molecular typing as well as the latest changes in CPT coding will be presented.
